Exploration of Opportunities

In this strand, students develop the skills needed to research information about learning, work, and community opportunities. Students make connections between these opportunities and their personal career goals. They learn about trends in the workplace, in the local and global economy, and in society. Students learn the benefits of having a broad range of skills to meet the demands of the changing global market.

Preparation for Transitions and Change

In their work in this strand, students learn to anticipate and respond to change. They develop knowledge, skills, and strategies that can smooth the transitions between different stages and roles in life. They prepare themselves for postsecondary learning and for the challenges of finding and creating work opportunities. They also develop their ability to make effective decisions, set goals, plan, act on plans, and evaluate and modify plans in response to changes.
