Course Description:	<p>This course gives students the opportunity to examine the world's faith traditions from both a Catholic and a Canadian perspective. World Religions introduces students to the various expressions and responses to humanity's encounter with mystery in our quest for life's meaning. The course explores the life wisdom found in the responses of the major faith traditions to the compelling questions concerning the spiritual dimension of human experience, self-understanding, and the role of the individual within the family. The teaching of World Religions in Catholic schools is a response to the Vatican II Document, <i>Declaration on the Relation of the Church to Non-Christian Religions (Nostra Aetate)</i></p> <p><i>The church examines with great care the relation which she has to non-Christian religions. Ever aware of the duty to foster unity and charity among individuals, and even among nations, she reflects at the outset on what (human persons) have in common and what tends to promote fellowship among them. (Article 1)</i></p>
